

Upper Division English Composition Exam 2007 – 2008

After completing 70 units, all students have the option of taking a challenge exam for the English Composition requirement. In the Colleges of Letters & Sciences, Agriculture & Environmental Sciences, and Biological Sciences students can test out of the entire English Composition requirement; in the College of Engineering, students test out of only the upper division course. Administered by the College of Letters and Science, the Upper Division Writing Exam is offered once each quarter (excluding summer sessions). The exam does not yield credit. Students may take the exam a maximum of two times.

If you decide to take this challenge exam, you should do so as soon as you have accumulated 70 units. **Do not wait until your senior year.** If you do not pass, you may make an appointment with a Composition Examination Counselor to find out why. Then, you have the opportunity to take the exam one more time.

RESULTS

You (and the dean of your college) will be notified of the results by e-mail approximately two weeks after the examination date.

IMPORTANT: Do not take this exam if you are currently enrolled in a course that satisfies the upper-division composition requirement for your college, as exam results will not be available until after the final add/drop deadline.
