

## **ELECTIVE COURSES WITH NO OR MINIMAL PREREQUISITES FOR FALL 2009 For College of Biological Sciences Incoming Transfer Students Only**

Looking for elective courses to balance out your fall quarter schedule? In this handout you will find elective courses with minimal to no prerequisites. They are loosely grouped in the interest categories listed below. Some are listed in several different categories.

No credit for duplicated courses. If you have taken a course at your institution you will not receive credit for the same/equivalent UCD course. You can check for duplication at [www.assist.org](http://www.assist.org) for California community college courses. All other students should see an adviser before taking a possible duplicate course.

Course descriptions are given in the UCD General Catalog 2008-2010 or at the general catalog website <http://registrar.ucdavis.edu/ucdwebcatalog/>. If the title or description sounds familiar it may be a duplicate. Community college courses are not equivalent to an upper division course at UCD.

You may check if the course is currently open by accessing the Open Course Listing at <http://registrar.ucdavis.edu/ocl/opencourses.html>. If the course you want is closed, a waiting list becomes available during your Pass 2 appointment. Some courses are closed to nonmajors or certain class levels during Pass 1, but open to everyone during Pass 2; waiting lists are also available for these courses.
